

CONSULTATION ON MAJOR STUDIES Aggregate Resource Master Plan Growth Management Strategy

NOTICE OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION: The County of Lanark is undertaking two major studies that will impact long term land use planning within the County. The related reports are currently available in a draft form for review and comment. They contain background information and direction that may inform future updates of the Lanark County Official Plan. The Aggregate Resources Master Plan (ARMP) is the first of its kind for Lanark County. The Growth Management Strategy is a 5-year update.

The Open House will be held on March 20 at 6:00 - 8:00pm in the Lanark Council Chambers at 99 Christie Lake Road, Perth. An introductory presentation will be given at 6:15. The lead project consultant and Planning Manager will be available to answer questions and receive feedback.

Please note: the Aggregate Open House is related to the regional issue of aggregate resource planning and designation. **Specific ongoing applications will not be the focus of this open house.** Those files have separate processes and public consultation. We ask that you kindly respect this division of files and process.
