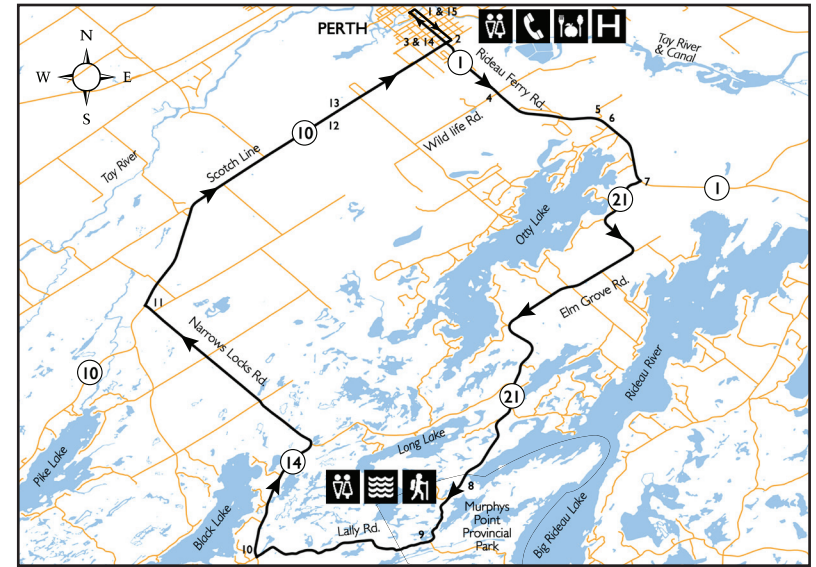
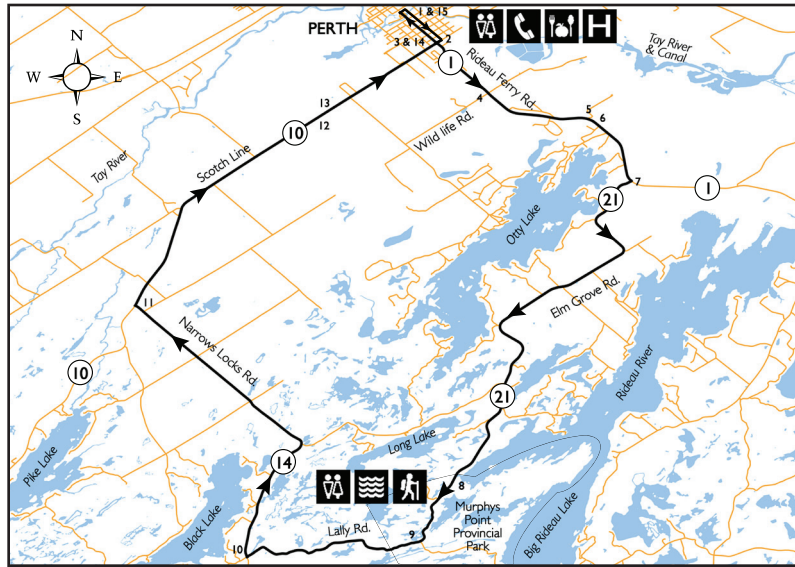


# PERTH AREA CYCLING ROUTES



- 1 Leave the **CRYSTAL PALACE** parking lot, go East on Drummond St. Check out the **ECOPERTH FOREST** - an urban carbon sink.
- 1.1 2 Turn right onto South St. at the T intersection.
- 1.2 3 Turn left onto Gore St., which becomes Rideau Ferry Road (County Road #1) to leave town.
- 2.9 4 Consider a side trip down Wild Life Rd. to the **PERTH WILDLIFE RESERVE**, a 96 hectare sanctuary.
- 4.8 5 Browse for treasures at **PIONEER ANTIQUES**.
- 5.0 6 **MILLER BROOK FARMS**, former home of Big Ben, on the left.
- 7.0 7 Turn right onto Elm Grove Rd. (County Road #21) and follow the signs to Murphys Point Provincial Park. This road is a winding country road with little traffic, gravel shoulders and rough pavement in places. The view here is typical of the Frontenac Axis - the most southerly extension of the Canadian Shield.
- 17.5 8 **MURPHYS POINT PROVINCIAL PARK**. Consider stopping for a picnic and a swim (free access for cyclists). There is a park store here. Take care on the park roads and enjoy the shade.

- 19.9 9 **SILVER QUEEN MINE** and **LALLY HOMESTEAD**. Two relics of the past. Follow the 2 km hike into the Silver Queen mine. Guided tours are also available. Check with the Park for guided tour times.
- 22.8 10 Turn right at the stop sign onto Narrows Locks Road (County Road #14). This is a long open stretch with little shade, gravel shoulders and some rough pavement.
- 31.0 11 Stop and turn right onto Scotch Line (County Road #10). The pavement is smooth and traffic is heavier here.
- 36.6 12 Find **SCOTCH LINE PRODUCE** on the right with a vegetable stand.
- 37.7 13 **TREELAND APPLE ORCHARDS** on the left.
- 40.3 14 Turn left at the first lights onto Gore St.
- 41.3 15 Turn right onto Basin St. to return to the **CRYSTAL PALACE**.
